From the
Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners:

One of the most important aspects of our life is that of "work." In our current situation when many individuals have lost their job, we realize more than ever the significance of work and its impact on our soul and on our society. Recently, I reread a chapter in Aelred Squire's *Asking the Fathers*, a series of essays dealing with the our faith and what our tradition has to offer by way of insight and guidance. Chapter 8 is simply entitled "Work" and here are some points the author makes:

- three problems: not working at all, working too much, working in the wrong way
- there is a real possibility of finding joy in our work in that we participate in God's providence
- work is a potentially ennobling activity if done in the right way
- in work we often discover our capacity and mould our being
- when work is done only for pay it can be dehumanizing
- work can unite us with reality and our fellow human being
- work can discharge energies that can otherwise turn narcissistic and aggressive
- the degree of engagement of mind and heart in our work makes it genuinely human
- work done with intelligence and insight can be a form of love

Back in 1985, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops published a document on the economy. In that pastoral letter, a theology of work was presented stressing four points: work provides for a living; work allows us to use our gift(s); work contributes to the common good; and, work furthers God's creative design. Again, this presumes that work is done with intelligence and insight, and that the worker has a sense of how his or her work does make a difference.

It was Voltaire who wrote: "I have only twenty acres," replied the Turk. "I cultivate them with my children; and work keeps at bay three great evils: boredom, vice and need." It was the poet Tennyson who said: "He works his work, I mine." And the novelist George Eliot comments: "You must be sure to two things: you must love your work and not be always looking over the edge of it, wanting your play to begin. And the other is, you must not be ashamed of your work, and think it would be more honorable to you to be doing something else."

Labor Day has passed but our labor has not.

WELCOME BACK TO SCHOOL

We have had a great first few days of school. Everyone seems to be adjusting well. This year, along with the entire parish, we will focus our year on studying the four pillars of the Catholic Faith—Creed, Sacrament, Goodness and Justice, Prayer. Generations of Disciples, at Resurrection, is a great opportunity to learn and grow in your faith as a family. The first evening was held on Wednesday, September 9.

Again this year, teachers will focus on integrating Faith throughout all aspects of the curriculum and day helping children spread God's love through actions toward one another, honoring and respecting all the varied gifts God has given. We will continue to use four agreements in order to help each person know they are valued, to listen attentively to one another, respect for self, others and things, recognize the good in each other—appreciations—no put downs, and having the right to pass and not participate when something is uncomfortable. We will also continue to work with children on self-discipline skills—skills for growing up.

The week prior to school all our teachers were involved in a technology conference with all the teachers in the GRACE system. It was an exciting couple days. As much as possible, teachers are hoping to implement technology into all curricular areas. We are working on plans for prioritizing and funding different equipment that may be needed.
