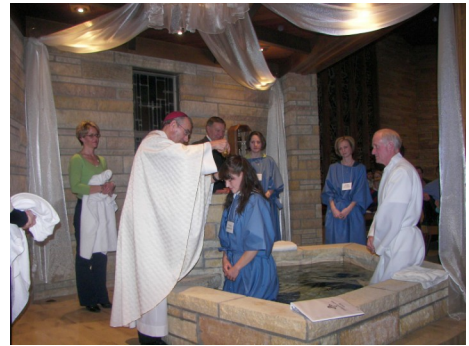


# SACRAMENTS

**BAPTISM**—We are welcomed and initiated into the family of God.

Infants and very young children are baptized during the Mass in the presence of the community who welcome them into the community of faith.

Expectant parents should contact the parish office 2 months before the birth of the child to plan for the baby's Baptism.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**—Whenever people are seriously ill, preparing for surgery, suffering with a long-term illness or seriously affected by the aging process, the Church encourages them to receive the Sacrament of the Sick (Anointing). This anointing may take place in church, at home, at the hospital, or in a nursing home. Each year a communal celebration of anointing is scheduled at a weekend liturgy. Contact Bp. Robert Morneau.

**HOLY ORDERS**—Resurrection Parish actively encourages men of the parish to study for the priesthood and permanent diaconate. Preparation for ordination is done on the diocesan level over several years of discernment and study.
