Vision, Community, Inclusion, Renewal!

As we contemplate this Sunday's Gospel, we hear Jesus speak about the Holy Spirit: the role, the work, the purpose of the Spirit sent by God in Jesus' name. The Spirit will teach us everything, serving as a reminder of the ways of Christ, not the ways or things of the



world but the ways of God. We have long recognized choosing to live as disciples of Christ is a call to build relationships based in love and care, forgiveness, peace, justice and equity for all - not just for our own but for everyone -- which is too often contrary to the ways or the things of society. Jesus knew standing against the ways and things of the world would not be easy, thus the promise of help from the Holy Spirit.

This Sunday's readings, from Acts, the Psalm, the reading from Revelation, and the Gospel, carry messages for us, calling us to trust in the Spirit in our efforts to keep God's word. The Spirit, our Advocate as named by Jesus, calls us to lifelong learning and growth, change, and openness as the love of God never stagnates. The love of God is to be shared with all nations, all peoples, all the ends of the earth, all tribes from every direction. As Jesus say, "... the Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have told you.... peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.....do not let your hearts be troubled."

Discerning the ways of the Spirit requires patience, prayer, listening to others, trust in a greater good, non-judgmental love, compromise, collaboration, openness to change, and faith in many unseen things. No easy feat in our hustle bustle what's-init-for-me/my way or the highway/get-er-done world of today! Every day I wonder why it seems the way of life to which the Spirit calls us, the ways of Christ, why are they all so darn complicated? Or are they? Who or what creates all these complications? It must be somebody else's fault.... Right? I mean, what roles could I possibly play in such complications? (gulp)

Jesus knew the power of community, connections, and relationships. Please support me in my attempts to love as God loves; in addition to the Spirit, I would love your company, inspiration, and wisdom in discerning my role in responding to the call of the Holy Spirit!
