


Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time November 11 & 12, 2023



May Wisdom Live On

Last spring my uncle Ted passed into eternal life in western Wisconsin. Between he and my uncle Robert, who died years ago, they both provided sage wisdom as I loved to listen to their stories at family gatherings in my grandma's kitchen. A common denominator of both men, besides being brothers, is that they served our country in the armed forces. Both were extremely proud of this service and helped us to hold the same pride. As we celebrate Veterans' Day this weekend, I remember them and all of the people in my life who have served our country. But I also celebrate the wisdom that they have passed on to me and my siblings.

Both the first reading this weekend from the Book of Wisdom and the Gospel from Matthew address the issue of wisdom. The Book of Wisdom passage begins with this quote: "Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her and found by those who seek her" (Wis 6:12). As I celebrated my 60th birthday recently, I couldn't help but think of something my dad used to say. He would recollect his age and talk about his Uncle Bill and his own age. My dad was fond of saying: "I used to think that Uncle Bill was old at this age (fill in the blank with the age!) but now I don't think that is old at all!" I'm thinking the same thing. I used to think my parents were so old at age 60 and had such sage wisdom. But now I don't think they were THAT old at 60. And I wonder when my own wisdom will mysteriously appear!

Which leads to our Gospel from Matthew this weekend. In the well-known story about the wise virgins and the foolish ones. The wise virgins prepared for the bridegroom's arrival by preparing their lanterns. But the foolish ones let their lantern wicks burn too low for the long haul. This gets us thinking about wisdom as well. Are we wise? More importantly, who do we look to for that sage wisdom that we need in our lives? Parents, uncles and aunts, grandparents, teachers, coaches, supervisors, friends--all may have played a role in providing the wisdom that we needed in various situations in our life. This week try to spend a little time making a list of those wise, old owls in your life; the people you count on to give you that wise advice when needed. I know for me, as we celebrate Veterans' Day 2023, I'll be thinking about Uncle Ted and Uncle Robert. May they rest in peace. But may their wisdom live on!



Synod publishes final report and votes: Calls for more discussion on synodality, women deacons and more

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- A report summarizing discussions at the assembly of the Synod of Bishops said the church may need more welcoming pastoral approaches, especially to people who feel excluded, but also acknowledged fears of betraying traditional church teachings and practices.

Among the topics addressed in the report were clerical sexual abuse, women's roles in the church, outreach to poor and the concept of "synodality" itself.

The assembly's discussions set the stage for a year-long period of reflection that will culminate in the second and final synod assembly in late 2024 on the same topic.

The 41-page synthesis report, voted on paragraph-by-paragraph Oct. 28, described its purpose as presenting "convergences, matters for consideration and proposals that emerged from the dialogue" on issues discussed under the headings of synodality, communion, mission and participation.

Within the synod topics, members looked at **the role of women** in the church, including in decision making, and at the possibility of ordaining women deacons. The report asked for more "theological and pastoral research on the access of women to the diaconate," including a review of the conclusions of commissions Pope Francis set up in 2016 and 2020.

Assembly members also discussed pastoral approaches to welcoming and including in the life of parishes **people who have felt excluded**, including the poor, people with disabilities, LGBTQ+ Catholics and Catholics whose marriages are not recognized by the church.

... it said, "in different ways, people who feel marginalized or excluded from the Church because of their marriage status, identity, or sexuality, also ask to be heard and accompanied. There was a deep sense of love, mercy and compassion felt in the Assembly for those who are or feel hurt or neglected by the Church, who want a place to call 'home' where they can feel safe, be heard and respected, without fear of feeling judged."

In several places throughout the report, assembly members insisted that greater efforts must be made to listen to the **survivors of clerical sexual abuse** and those who have endured spiritual or psychological abuse.

"Openness to listening and accompanying all, including those who have suffered abuse and hurt in the Church, has made visible many who have long felt invisible," it said. "The long journey toward reconciliation and justice, including addressing the structural conditions that abetted such abuse, remains before us, and requires concrete gestures of penitence."

...assembly members said, "We are confident that synodality is an expression of the dynamic and living Tradition."

"It is clear that some people are afraid that they will be forced to change; others fear that nothing at all will change or that there will be too little courage to move at the pace of the living Tradition," the report said.

Members of the assembly described the synodal process as being "rooted in the Tradition of the Church" and taking place in light of the teaching of the Second Vatican Council, particularly its emphasis on "the Church as Mystery and People of God, called to holiness."

Synodality, they said, "values the contribution all the baptized make, according to their respective vocations," and thus "constitutes a true act of further reception of the Council."
