





Election of Council Members

Gerry Faller, our Trustee Treasurer has completed his term. Father Tom is looking for a nominee(s) to fill this position. Any member of the Resurrection Catholic Congregation, confirmed and 18 years of age or older, shall be eligible for nomination to the Council as Trustees. The elected Trustee Treasurer shall serve a term of two years and may not serve more than three consecutive terms. The Trustee Treasurer is a member of the Finance Council overseeing the finances of the parish and signing checks. Please contact Bill Campion, our accountant, with your interest in the position. The election for the Trustee Treasurer will take place on the weekend of May 31/June 1.

The Pastoral Council has three positions open for nominees. Only Resurrection Catholic Congregation registered members, confirmed and 18 years of age or older, shall be eligible to be a member of the council. Members should be committed to the mission of the parish. Terms for Council members are for 3 years, renewable once (total 6 years). Nomination forms will be in the pews weekends of May 17/18 and May 24/25. The selection will take place at the 4 PM Mass on May 31.


