The Lepers Among Us

John and Mary are treated like lepers. That is the conclusion I have drawn after the last six weeks of providing a positive presence on the streets of Green Bay with StreetLights Outreach, which includes a number of team members from Resurrection Parish. Why are John and Mary lepers in our community? They suffer from severe mental illness and are homeless--sleeping outside of the fence at St. John's Park as the park is locked up for the night at 8 p.m.



Both the first reading from Second Kings and the Gospel according to St. Luke address the issue of leprosy. In the first reading, Naaman is cured of leprosy by plunging himself into the Jordan River seven times at the direction of the prophet Elisha. In the Gospel, we have the story of the ten lepers who are cured by Jesus and only one comes back to express his gratitude. But here is an important point in the Gospel story. The leper who comes back is a Samaritan. The people of Samaria were despised by Jews for centuries. Most people avoided Samaria, even traveling far out of their way to skirt the area. So, in a way, this leper suffers from a sort of "double leprosy." His skin disease and his ethnicity cause him to be an outcast.

Which brings us back to John and Mary. Why are they not in a shelter? For starters, until November 1 when St. John's Homeless Shelter opens to full capacity and the new women's shelter, Wellspring, is able to welcome our sisters who are homeless, there is no room in the inn. And the New Community Shelter is full. Yet, John and Mary will have a difficult time in shelter. Why? Their mental illness causes their behavior to disrupt the normal life in the shelter. This is not easy on anyone.

The StreetLights Outreach Team continues to provide a presence on the streets, and meals near St. John's Park, on a weekly basis. And the people who we encounter are mostly grateful for the conversation and warm meal. Yet the one thing still needed as the nights become colder during October are blankets, sleeping bags, and tarps. If you have these items lying around the house taking up space, please bring them to the Gathering Space and place them on the cart provided. The "lepers" of our community will be forever grateful—just like Naaman and the Samaritan leper.



Resurrection invites you to join us for an Anointing of the Sick Mass on **Thursday, October 20 at 1:00 PM.**


