### The Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 12 & 13, 2023



**Discovering God in the Quiet After the Storm** I love a good storm! Not the kind that damages property and disrupts lives. But there is nothing like a good old-fashioned thunder and lightning storm on a summer night. Then there was that ONE storm! July 15, 1980.



My brother and I were home alone at our house in Eau Claire. Late in the evening, the storm sirens went off and the lights went out. 120 mile per hour straight line winds (the instruments at the airport broke at this point, so it could have been stronger!) came blowing through our city, knocking down seemingly every tree in this Tree City USA community and disrupting power for a week. My brother and I toggled between satisfying our curiosity by dipping our heads outside and hunkering down in the corner of the basement in fear. In the aftermath, much clean-up was necessary, and our family ate meals, sponsored by the American Red Cross at one of the local high schools, for a week. Eau Claire was literally a disaster site. THAT was quite a storm!

Today's readings talk about storms. In First Kings, the prophet Elijah takes shelter in a cave as strong winds, crushing rocks, fire, and an earthquake come storming into his life. Yet, Elijah discovered that God was not found in these disasters. God was found in the reflective, quiet moments that followed.

In the Gospel, a storm whips up on the Sea of Galilee as the disciples are out in the boat fishing. Meanwhile, Jesus is away, praying by himself on a mountain. While the disciples try to manage their vessels without drowning, they see Jesus appear, walking toward them on the water. The brave one, Peter, decides to give this walking on water thing a try himself. Like the cartoon characters who run off a cliff and fall only when they discover they are in midair, Peter begins to sink. Jesus reaches out a hand to save him. Once they were back in the safety of the boat, the storm calmed, and all was well.

There are so many storms and potential storms in our lives. Is God to be found in those stormy moments? Yes! But more likely, it is in the quiet reflection after the storm that we most discover God's presence. In these final days of summer, our call to action might be to take no action. Rather, a little quiet time at the cottage, the lake, on a walk, or biking on the trail might just be what the doctor, or better yet, God, has ordered for us to discover the sacredness, the holiness, that can be found in the storms of our lives.
