Celebrate Labor Day

Do you remember your first job? What was the job that gave you the most joy and that you saw as a labor of love? Whereas the Church liturgical calendar does not pay attention to the holiday schedule of one nation, it seems that there is a lot of laboring going on in the readings that we hear at Mass this weekend.



In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet speaks to those who are living in fear. Isaiah tells the Israelites that they should fear not because the Lord will make all things right. The blind will have sight, the deaf will hear, and so many aspects of nature that normally would not occur, like streams of water flowing in the desert, will be made possible because of the work of God.

In the Gospel reading from St. Mark, Jesus encounters a deaf man who also has a speech impediment. Instead of using this opportunity to prove a point or make a big show about the miracle that he was about to perform, Jesus pulls the man aside, so that the two can be alone. Then, Jesus puts his fingers in the man's ears and touches the man's tongue with his own saliva. But this is the part that really stands out for me and connects so well with the Labor Day weekend. Jesus groans! He literally groans out the words: "Be opened!" Is that Jesus working or what? This is truly a labor of love that Jesus is performing. The man is healed and begins to hear and speak immediately. Finally, human nature being what it is, the more that Jesus instructs the people not to talk about the miracle, they do the exact opposite! They are on fire with amazement and cannot contain their excitement. Whereas Jesus wanted this private time between himself and a man who needed healing, the act of healing creates more work for Jesus in the future.

What about us? What work gives us life? Think about the work you have done in your life. For me, it all started with a position as a busboy at a Howard Johnson's Hotel and Restaurant in Eau Claire. The manager had no choice but to give me a job when I stopped in several times a week for almost two months inquiring whether there was a position for me.
