Loving What We Have vs. Having What We Love

Do you remember way back when? Do you remember that first feeling of attraction to another person? I bet you do! For me, it was a girl I went to grade school with (I'll call her Amanda, just in case she is reading this from afar!) We met in third grade as our two Catholic schools were merged into one in my hometown of Eau Claire. I swear I spent my entire middle school athletic career showing off for Amanda. Did she notice me? Probably not! But I thought I was in love. A true love, a deep love, a love I thought would last forever.

And then I grew up! I learned that love is not so much a feeling as a commitment and a way of being. Sure, feelings are involved, but if a relationship is built on the sandy ground of feelings, the relationship will not last long.

Which brings me to a couple of quotes that I have been thinking of a lot this week as we move toward Valentine's Day on Tuesday. Both quotes are from Fr. Richard Rohr, OFM, founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, New Mexico. The first is this: "In the second half of our life we move more away from having what we love to loving what we have." Do I strive to obtain the things that I love? Or do I truly love who and what I have in my life already, such as the TV that sits in my living room, the car that sits in my garage, or the relationships that I have developed over the years. It is a big challenge to love what we already have!

The second quote from Rohr speaks to the loving community that we are called to be as a Church. Rohr states that "the supreme tasks of the Church are healing, reconciling, forgiving, and peacemaking." I do not believe he is merely talking about the Sunday experience; he is talking about us as a loving community, rising to love all God's people all the time. Yes, here in church at Mass, coffee and rolls, programs, and prayer groups but also in our families, our neighborhoods, in our wider community, our nation, and the world.

God is love. Deep love. Unconditional love. And if we are to imitate God, to truly be made in the image and likeness of this Source of All Being that we worship, then we are called to be love as well.

What does the Bible say about sexuality, about inclusion and acceptance, and how we respond to the LGBTQ community with the love of Christ?






