## Bible Recommendations from Fr. Bob

Good day and God's blessing upon you and yours this 29th week in ordinary time. Today, I would like to take a moment to finish my Bible selection mini-series with some recommendations in case you are thinking about selecting a Bible to read or for a gift. The good news (pun intended) is that we live in a golden age of Bible publication. But, with all the choices available, I thought some specific recommendations might be helpful.

For young Catholic people or people new to the faith, I recommend the Catholic Youth Bible from St. Mary's Press. This Bible has lots of color, fun graphics, and pictures, although I have only seen the paperback version. The Catholic Youth Bible comes in the NAB and RSV translations. The NAB is what we use at Mass, the RSV is a very popular translation, a bit more of a word-for-word translation. The NAB is a balanced translation when considering word-for-word versus thought-for-thought. And yes, the font-size is quite small, no problem for young people, a bit more challenging for young at heart people.

My second Catholic Bible recommendation is for people who have a bit of background when it comes to reading the Bible, and who want a study Bible with lots of wonderful explanatory footnotes and word explanations. This is the Ignatius Catholic Study Bible, recently published as one whole Bible. It is massive in size, but a beautiful storehouse of explanation and illumination of the Bible with the fullness of the Catholic faith in mind as the reader studies. This Bible is an RSV Bible 2nd Catholic Edition. The font size is OK. The notes are a little smaller, still OK but I must take my time.

If you are reading a Bible aloud to a group of people, let us say at a Bible study, then there is no substitute for the Great Adventure Bible, the 13 pt font edition. The large font size makes this Bible ideal for reading out-loud in small group situations. Again, this is an RSV second Catholic edition Bible.




