Radical Poverty

Lent is a time of radical poverty. The hope of Lent is to gift us with opportunities of prayer, fasting and almsgiving that would provide a different lens as we view our lives and the world around us. With the help of this church liturgical season, our prayers to the Holy Spirit, the visions of the saints and our own desire to walk more closely on God's path of salvation, we enter into a radical shift in who we are as followers of Jesus.



We can imagine what it must have been like for the early disciples of Jesus as they absorbed the fullness of Jesus' message of salvation as it unfolded more and more each day. Their hopes were heightened. Their lives were changing each day. They saw the impact of Jesus' message as people reacted positively and negatively toward their small community. Then we see the signs of Jesus' desire to enter into Jerusalem as we celebrate on Palm Sunday. This must have brought great excitement and great fear.

Yet this is what both St. Francis of Assisi and St. Catherine of Siena must have felt as they found themselves in very difficult situations within the Church of their times. St. Francis did not desire the riches of his family or the riches of the Church. Both the Church and the society of that era had mostly left behind the radical gospel message Jesus left with us. Francis would have none of it. Maybe Pope Francis felt the same when he chose his name upon becoming the Bishop of Rome.

St. Catherine of Siena desired radical truth, love and charity. The church of her time was not modeling these attributes in her life and community. So Catherine took it upon herself to reform the church as she worked to unify the divisions within the papal leadership. Her success came in being true to her encounter with a God of truth, love and charity.

Radical poverty means we let go of our comforts and riches as we build up the Church as a community of hope and joy alive and well today. Maybe this is what Jesus intended for his time on earth as he cleansed the temple and declared himself an eternal temple of God's presence.

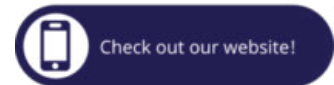

Every saint's life is marked by moments when God's grace was upon them. The saints teach us to embrace these moments and to allow them to change our minds and hearts. This Lent, Resurrection turns toward Moments of Grace – moments of God's presence bringing peace, blessing, and a sense of connection.

St. Francis of Assisi 1182-1226

***“All praise be yours, my Lord, through all that you have made,
And first my lord Brother Sun,
Who brings the day; and light you give to us through him.
How beautiful is he, how radiant in all his splendor!”***

Francis gathered a community of like-minded individuals to live out a radical commitment to the Gospel of poverty. As a mystic, he challenges us to be stewards of creation and to live in harmony with nature. Just as Jesus drove out the distractions of the temple, so Francis calls us during Lent to renew our commitment to the Gospel message, to revitalize our lives and those of others, to promote social justice, and to actively participate in environmental programs and projects. In these Moments of Grace, we touch the radical poverty that keeps us dependent on God's love and mercy.

St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380)

“If you have received my love sincerely without self-interest, you will drink your neighbor's love sincerely. It is just like a vessel that you fill at the fountain. If you take it out of the fountain to drink, the vessel is soon empty. But if you hold your vessel in the fountain while you drink, it will not get empty; indeed, it will always be full.”

Catherine is one of only four women granted the title of Doctor of the Roman Catholic Church.

Through her writings, as found in *The Dialogue*, she taught and encouraged those whose spiritual welfare about the way to God was her concern. In them, she offered a comprehensive understanding of what she had learned about Divine truth, love, and charity. Catherine was instrumental in cleansing the church of her time and in convincing the Pope to return to Rome from Avignon.

Catherine gifts us with Moments of Grace transforming us into the waters of our Baptism, Penance, Confirmation, and Marriage commitments, and to drink from the real presence of the Eucharist so that our spiritual lives will not suffer from sacramental draught.



Jesus said "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die."

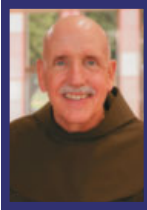

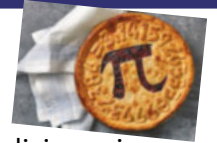
