#### Bible Recommendations - Part II from Fr. Bob

Are you into art? Is beauty important to you? Do you use your Bible more for reflection than for study? My favorite Bible is the Word-on-Fire Bible, published by Word on Fire. It is a seven-volume Bible with five parts now published and two more to go. The explanations are mainly overviews of complete passages given by saints and theologians down through history with plenty of commentary by Bishop Robert Barron along the way. As I implied, this Bible has lots of art to illuminate the Biblical narrative, as well as explain it. This Bible is in the NRSV translation (a bit more modern sounding than the RSV). It is a bit of an investment as it is in seven parts. This Bible comes in paperback, hardback, and leatherbound editions, priced accordingly. In my opinion, the price is well worth the investment. Biased opinion here, as Bishop Barron was my favorite seminary professor. The website is wordonfire.org

Looking for something unique? The Knox Bible is a unique translation by Fr. Ronald Knox, published in the 1940's and 1950's. He is English so this translation is in modern English, and it sounds very English. This Bible is still popular today, especially in... England! I love this translation, but it is an acquired taste.

Looking for a traditional sounding Catholic Bible? Then the Douay-Rheims Bible may well be for you. If you like a King James sounding Bible, but want a Catholic Bible, this might interest you. This is the Bible that was used at Mass prior to, let us say, 1960.

Looking for a Protestant Bible? My favorites include the CSB Baker Study Bible. It has lots of great commentary, book introductions, charts, maps, and graphics. It is a great all-around study Bible. Unfortunately, it is out of print, but I hear a new edition is coming in the spring of 2026. If I had a Protestant friend who was looking to get into serious Bible study this is the Bible I would recommend, and yes experienced Catholics could read this Bible with great benefit and instruction. The NIV Cultural Background Study Bible is also extremely helpful in understanding the various cultures of the ancient Near East. Finally, the Holy Land Study Bible has tremendous pictures and articles.

# Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA

Our parish will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), a collection approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years.

The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - including those from our own parish and diocese.

The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment.


