

### What Do You Wish For?

Picture four brothers sitting around a late-night campfire. The brothers are of the fifty-something vintage with one exception in their early sixties. Here's a hint; I am the exception. While watching the flames and enjoying a cold

beverage, we reminisced about our Catholic faith, our families, and about our careers. One of my younger brothers reflected on how, as a child in a local Catholic grade school, we went to Mass during the week and with our parents every weekend. He said that he was deeply inspired by the wisdom of Solomon and that became a frequent prayer.

As I was reading the first reading for this weekend, 1 Kings 3:5-12, I realized this is the reading my brother was talking about. I was deeply moved by how humble Solomon was in his prayer "Give your servant, therefore, an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong." And God replied, "Because you have asked for this— not for a long life for yourself, nor for riches, nor for the life of your enemies, but for understanding so that you may know what is right—I do as you requested. I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one to equal you."

While God encourages us to ask him for any desire of our hearts such as a new puppy, an "A" on a math test, a promotion at work, a good friend, improved health, etc., we should always be mindful of the wisdom of Solomon and to pray for the good of the larger community. In our Sunday Liturgy, we do this in the Prayers of the Faithful (petition prayers). We begin by praying for the needs of the larger communities of the Church and the world, and we conclude by praying for our own intentions. Beyond the prayers of the Church and our ministry and work to Rise Toward Loving All God's People All The Time, what do you wish/pray for?
