Might You "Do" Advent Differently This Year?

For many years, on the day after Christmas - technically the official First Day of Christmas – I would find myself wishing it was the last day of Christmas! Worn out and tired, I could be found vowing (or my family might say ranting!) Christmas needed to be re-evaluated, re-framed, re-habilitated from the chaos of too much and re-focused on the true meaning of Christmas. Yet, by the time December rolled around, I would find myself on the fast track to that all too familiar frenzy. I would give into the habits driven by some sense of keeping up with the "Joneses" when it came to decorating, baking, shopping, wrapping, list making, more shopping, entertaining, cooking, seasonal events, did I mention shopping? What did I need to break that mad-rush-to-Santa-cycle I knew would turn me into Mrs. Scrooge by December 26th?

Some years ago, I learned of a world-wide movement called the Advent Conspiracy – "Called to Celebrate Advent Differently." The Advent Conspiracy was founded on the idea we should celebrate Christmas humbly, beautifully, generously, in ever-deepening relationship with others, standing firm in our belief the season is to be about Jesus and his mission in our world – calling us to build the Kingdom of God here and now. Jesus lived with the intention in which he challenges us, to support the most vulnerable, to challenge the culture of the day, to buck the status quo which openly suppresses certain groups of people. According to Jesus, building the Kingdom of God means living relationally, sharing our time, energy, talents, and our presence, which all boil down into the best presents we can give to another --- not something we can replace with yet another Amazon purchase.

Advent is the story of a wondrous moment when God entered our world to make things right; the greatest story ever told, and it changes everything. So, over the course of the next four weeks of Advent, let's consider how we might reclaim the true meaning of Christmas: Emmanuel-God With Us, as we explore the call to prepare differently. Join the Conspiracy in a shared effort to worship more fully, spend less money, give more of ourselves, and to love all.

Worship Fully, Spend Less, Give More, Love All



Year End Gifts to Resurrection

Did you know that you can gift appreciated stock or mutual funds that you have held for more than one year directly to Resurrection?

You may take a charitable tax deduction for the market value of the stock, and neither you nor the charity has to pay capital gains taxes when the stock is sold.

Also, if you are over the age of 72, Qualified Charitable Distribution rules allow you to make IRA distributions payable directly to a qualified charity without treating the distribution as taxable income.
