


Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 23 & 24, 2024

CARE FOR CREATION COMMITTEE

Our commitment to leading environmental stewardship efforts at Resurrection and reducing the Parish's carbon footprint is formally laid out in our environmental stewardship resolution, which was approved by the Parish Council in November 2024.

Resolution on Reducing Resurrection Parish's Carbon Footprint and Committing to Environmental Stewardship

Whereas Pope Francis in *Laudato si'* (24 May, 2015) and *Laudate Deum* (4 October, 2023) articulated the adverse impact man is having on God's creation and our responsibility for environmental stewardship;

Whereas, Fr. Tom Reynebeau, Pastor of Resurrection Catholic Parish, called together and tasked the Care For Creation Committee with developing strategies to reduce Resurrection Parish's impact on the environment and educating the Parish on what we as a parish and as individuals can do to be better stewards of God's Creation; and,

Whereas the Resurrection campus has grown its energy needs (namely the school's air conditioning as of summer 2023), has begun implementing improvements (through the installation of LED lights and a new HVAC control system), and has capacity for further improvement;

Whereas the Care For Creation Committee has developed strategies to reduce the Parish's carbon footprint and facilitate the Parish becoming informed, faithful stewards of the environment and the Parish's economic resources; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Resurrection Parish Pastoral Council:

- 1. acknowledges the environmental impact of human activity, both locally and globally, and embraces the challenge to be responsible stewards of God's creation articulated in *Laudato si*' and *Laudate Deum*;
- 2. empowers the Resurrection Parish's Care for Creation to develop and spearhead the implementation of strategies to reduce the Parish's carbon footprint and promote individual and community actions to improve our environmental stewardship; and,
- 3. supports the Care For Creation Committee's initial goal of reducing the Parish's energy consumption (gas, as measured in Therms, or BTUs; and electrical, as measured in kilowatt-hours) by 20% by July 1, 2026 while improving the comfort of those using the church and school buildings.
- 4. encourages the Parish's members, their families, ministries, committees, and staff to explore traditional and innovative ways to follow Pope Francis's call to be good stewards of God's creation.
