I would like to begin writing by saying I have an appreciation and a special place in my heart for Catholic Schools. I am proud to say that I attended St. Mary of the Angels Catholic grade school on Irwin Street in Green Bay for eight years. We had the Franciscan priests from Pulaski who came to the classroom often to share their faith with us. The Sisters who taught us were the Sisters of St. Joseph, Third Order of St. Francis from Stevens Point. We didn't have any lay staff. We attended Mass each day at 8 AM, walking across the street to the church. This was in the 1950's, so we were required to fast starting at midnight so we could receive the Eucharist at Mass. Moms and dads provided a sandwiches for us to eat after Mass (mine was usually a scrambled egg sandwich). We could then buy a carton of white or chocolate milk for two cents. The Sisters gave us fifteen minutes after Mass to eat our sandwich. The big treat was on the First Friday of each month, when we could buy long johns with lots of white frosting and milk. We had a bakery that would sell the long johns for 5 cents and then the milk for 2 cents. What a joy and treat that was!

Upon graduating from St. Mary of the Angels, I attended Washington for my freshman year and then graduated from East High School. During my high school years, I attended St. Mary of the Angels CCD classes for my continued religion instruction.

Working three years in a glove factory after graduation soon convinced me that I had a different calling in my life. I then attended UWGB, graduating in 1970 with a degree in elementary education. My first experience in public education was at Danz School in Green Bay, where I taught kindergarten, first and second grades for 14 years. What a joy that was for me! The children and families were so much a part of my life. Their stories of joy, struggles, and my ministry listening, and supporting them, were a real faith experience for me! It opened my eyes to realize not everyone had what I had, but I could help them and learn from them.

This encouraged me to attend UW-Milwaukee and obtain a master's degree so I could then become the principal of a public school and work with teachers to have the same faith experiences I had at Danz School. My staff of 72 and 550 students became a family at Laura Ingalls Wilder School. We had students from many cultures and economic backgrounds. Our ministry was helping the children to know that God cares, and we care about each one of them. The staff was outstanding!! We were able to celebrate the birth of new children and their baptisms by sharing pictures and stories with the families. We were able to celebrate their First Communions by looking at their pictures and hearing about their parties. We opened a store in the school with the help of my mother, who took the lost and found clothes, etc. home, washed them, and put them in our store for the children to use when they came to school with no socks, mittens, hats, etc. Many donations came as well. The children would come to the office, and my kind secretary would welcome them into the store where they could select what they needed. We had a clipboard on the way out of our store so they could write their name and select how they would "pay" for what they took. My custodian helped by giving the children little tasks in the lunchroom to pay their debt.

Public school for me was truly a ministry shared with all families, whatever faith they practiced. I encourage all of us to have an open mind when we are supporting families as they make their decision to have their children in a Catholic school or in a public school. The families that attend Mass at Resurrection are from all different educational experiences. Let us always be kind and open to all!
