Call Your Shot

In 1960, the newly elected President of the United States, John F. Kennedy, called his shot. He said that an astronaut would walk on the moon before the end of the decade. On July 20, 1969, Neil Armstrong made that prediction a reality with the famous leap from a ladder and the words: "One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

Also in 1969, a young, brash quarterback for the New York Jets made a bold statement. He guaranteed a Super Bowl victory for his AFC Champions over the highly favored Baltimore Colts. On January 12 of that year, Broadway Joe Namath carried his team to victory in Miami in Super Bowl III. He called his shot!

In my own life, for years I dreamed of establishing a House of Hospitality in Green Bay, fashioned after similar houses around the country with the vision and spirit of Dorothy Day, the founder of the Catholic Worker Movement. After many attempts, and seemingly endless years later, Whatsoever You Do, Inc. bought the 1895-built Atkinson House on Velp Avenue to serve as the first House of Hospitality in Green Bay. That was our shot as an organization to make a difference in this community by providing a launching pad and a gathering space for our various outreach programs.

In Luke's Gospel for this weekend, we hear the sequel to the Road to Emmaus Story that immediately precedes this passage. The two disciples had raced back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples about the appearance of Jesus. They had recognized Him in the breaking of the bread. And just as they were doing so, and while the disciples were seemingly in a state of disbelief at this news, Jesus appears in their midst. He wonders why His followers would question His resurrection and now His appearance before their very eyes. Why? Because He had called His shot!

On several occasions in His earthly ministry He had predicted that He would die, but then, on the third day, He would rise again from the dead. Now that is calling a shot! As He stood before them in this upper room, He reminded them of His predictions, and those of the Scriptures dating back to Moses, all leading to this reality of a Risen Christ. Finally, He tells the fearful disciples that they are witnesses to these amazing occurrences.

What about us? Have we recognized the Risen Christ in the moments of grace in our lives? Or do we still remain in disbelief, not fully realizing that this is the way of the Christ—that life follows death. It's time to call our shot. How will the Christ rise in our life? All women are invited and encouraged to bring friends, neighbors, and relatives for a lovely day featuring a lunch with raffle baskets and door prizes.




World Day of Prayer - Vocations Vigil
