Rejected But Worthy

Meet my friend Bill. He has experienced homelessness his entire life. How does Bill cope with this lifetime of abuse, hunger, anxiety, violence, and broken dreams? He drinks. A lot! I've often thought—if I was in Bill's shoes, I would probably do the same.



Bill stayed at St. John's Homeless Shelter last season. And the season before that, and the one before that. But Bill can't stay in the shelter during the summer. Why? He didn't get a letter. Only people who got a letter from the shelter in April can stay there in the summer. No letter-no mattress-no shelter.

Bill slept on the steps of St. John the Evangelist Church earlier this summer. Until the "No Trespassing" signs were put up by the parish leadership. Then he moved across the street to stay at St. John's Park until the City of Green Bay decided to chain the park shut each night at 8:00 and all day on Sunday. Bill then moved to a new "residence" under the Mason Street Bridge. There he could rest each night with a dozen or more other "Bills" until the city put up "No Trespassing" signs there as well. Finally, Bill moved across the parking lot Other Times by Appointment to a small cluster of trees, hoping the trees would provide shelter from the wind and rain. That is until this week, when Bill and other people living in the woods were given notice that they needed to move within 72 hours.

Where is Bill to go? That is the million-dollar question. There are no shelters that will accept him. There are no public properties he is allowed to lay his head. Bill has no options because he has been rejected by our community due to his lifelong situation of homelessness.

This weekend we hear the story of the servants of the vineyard owner who were beaten and killed by the tenants. Even the vineyard owner's son is killed by these greedy and violent tenants. Finally, we have that famous line: "the stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." Jesus becomes the rejected, beaten, and killed son in the parable.

What about Bill? Will he become the cornerstone of our community? Two teachings might shape our response. Matthew 25 calls us to encounter the Risen Christ in the lives of those who are hungry, thirsty, sick, imprisoned, or a stranger. That's Bill. And Gandhi taught "the true measure of any society can be found in how it treats its most vulnerable members." That's Bill as well.

This month we have an opportunity to support the Bills of our community. StreetLights Outreach, sponsored by Whatsoever You Do, Inc., is collecting blankets, sweatshirts, tarps, and sleeping bags to help our brothers & sisters, who are experiencing homelessness, keep warm as the fall temperatures begin to cool off. 


