#### **Great Expectations**

Expectations! We all have them. Parents are expected to put a roof over the head and meal on the table for their children. The spouse of one who suffers from dementia is expected to provide care even when their partner does not know them anymore. A worker is expected to fulfill the dimensions of his or her job description to the

best of their ability. Expectations! Some we fulfill without even pausing to give them another thought. Others, however, come with a greater cost.

In this weekend's readings, we are told about the expectations of a leper in the time of Moses, as well as that of a first-century Jew. In the Book of Leviticus, Moses and Aaron are instructed by God that if a person is declared unclean by the disease of leprosy, that man or woman is to present themselves to the priest. The priest will be the one to declare the person "unclean" due to this skin disease. That person was then expected to live on the outskirts of society, so as to not encounter and defile as unclean anyone whom they might meet. However, the expectation was that the person would call out "Unclean, unclean" if he or she encounters another person on the path, so that the other would not themselves become a victim of leprosy.

This Law of Moses from Leviticus would have been the ruling norm of the day in the time of Jesus. Yet, when a leper encounters Jesus, instead of yelling out "unclean, unclean," the leper reaches out to Jesus and asks for healing—to be made clean. Then, Jesus gives the newly-healed leper a new expectation. He is to present himself to the priest—not to be declared unclean, but rather, to be judged as "clean."

There are plenty of people that we have sent to the outskirts, to the margins of our society. And in some ways, the expectation is that they are to stay there, and in their own way yell out "unclean, unclean" to those who encounter them. Our brothers and sisters who experience homelessness, immigrants, our LGBTQ+ community members, those with a different color of skin than ours, and those with a disability of any kind, all are either physically or psychologically and emotionally sent to the margins so as to not be touched by the mainstream society.

As Christians, what is our expectation in our treatment of these "new lepers"? To love! To touch! To heal! To declare not only clean, but worthy—worthy of our love and that of God. These are great expectations. But if Christianity was easy, with no expectations, would we really want to be part of such a religion? As we move into this upcoming Season of Lent on Wednesday, we begin a 40-day journey of seeking the moments of grace, the moments of healing that are placed before us. Let's expect to experience the holy!

Taizé Prayer is a meditative prayer form. It is filled with song, Scripture, and silent meditation.



# Anointing Mass






During the liturgy, all who wish to receive the Sacrament of the Sick can be anointed. Anointing is for anyone experiencing physical, emotional, or spiritual distress.


