
Resurrection Catholic Darish Becoming Disciples of Jesus and Stewards of God's Gifts

Res On Mission!

As the new Diocesan Director of Youth Ministry in 1994, I remember when I led a group to the first Young Neighbors in Action experience in Harford, CT. All of us, both teenagers and adults, had a life-changing conversion experience as most of us truly heard and experienced the Gospel and Catholic Social Teaching, often for the first time. Our faith



was lived out in community, amongst the poor and vulnerable in a very economically diverse city. When we came back, there was one girl who wanted to take today's Gospel reading at its face value and give all of her possessions to the poor. Her mother called me up and was concerned that the girl would not have anything left in her closet to wear to school that week! We called an emergency meeting of the 15 people who had made the journey and attempted to put our experience into context. While we do need clothes (and other necessities) to live, we can be challenged to live more simply. From then on, whenever we went on a service immersion trip with young people, we talked about the ways to live more simply-short of selling every stitch of clothing that they own.

This week's Gospel IS challenging! It is harder for a rich person to enter into heaven than it is for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle? This Gospel does not actually make us feel all warm and cozy inside. It is challenging! But it seems that there are two keys to Mark's Gospel passage. First, it might not be possible for US to enter into heaven by what we have or what we do. But as the Gospel reminds us again, all things are possible with God. Secondly, Jesus reminds us that when we are generous—when we no longer have our possessions as our top priorities—we inherit much more in the eternal life to come.

Over these past few weeks, the Resurrection Parish community has had the opportunity to live this Gospel passage. With your help, three truckloads and a large trailer filled to the brim with new clothes were delivered to Camp McCoy for the Afghan refugees who are temporarily living there. The parish served as a storage site for some of these items and parish volunteers were the ones who made the packing and hauling of the items possible.



How Do We Do That?

See that God has given many blessings (This also teaches good self-esteem)

- Challenge yourself and others to make a list of all God's gifts to them! (Hint: no wrong answers!)
- Regularly compliment others on their special gifts simple things like nice handwriting, a pretty smile, a nice coat to keep you warm, etc. Remind them that this special gift is a blessing from God and offers an idea of how they can be grateful or share that gift with someone else.
- Encourage others to recognize their talents and the talents of other people in their lives. Every talent does not have to be star quality. Talents can be simple such as strong to carry a box, smart to help someone with homework, a good listener for someone with a problem.
