Shinrin-yoku

There is a Japanese expression, called Shinrin-yoku. Shinrin-yoku is also known as forest bathing or forest therapy. It's a practice or process of therapeutic relaxation. A person spends time in a forest or natural atmosphere. The process

focuses on sensory engagement to connect with nature. Studies in Japan indicate that this practice contributes to better health outcomes and a happier life.

I was reminded of this practice last week during our first big snowfall. It was so quiet. There was no one moving about in the complex I live in. I bundled up and went for a walk in the snow. I have always loved the quiet during and shortly after a winter storm, a quiet space where one can listen for and hear the soft whisper of God.

It reminded me of what quiet is. How beautiful it can be surrounded by quiet in nature. My walk reminded me of winter tent camping with my son's Boy Scout troop. We camped outdoors in tents. I realized how much I enjoyed and miss those camping trips. The quiet I experienced during those camping trips always reminded me of how much noise there was and is in my life.

I returned home after my walk feeling renewed and invigorated. Hot cocoa was the icing on the cake. I realize we can't all bundle up and head outside for forest therapy. But the Church in its wisdom has provided us these several weeks between Christmas Time and Lent for some spiritual bathing. It is a time to remind ourselves that, like Jonah, Simon, Andrew, James, and John, we each were called in our Baptism to a unique faith journey and vocation, which is unique for each of us.

We have the gift of time during this stretch of Ordinary Time to try some spiritual forest therapy. A time to ask ourselves, how am I answering my Baptism call to discipleship? Have I been ignoring the call? Has the Holy Spirit tried to whisper to me? Is the noise of my life blocking out the soft whisper of God? Ordinary Time is a gift. Let's not waste it.
