John 11



As the calendar moves closer to Easter, the readings this week provide yet another reminder of our hope-filled belief in God's promise of new life – that in death, life is changed but never ended. Imagining life after death, however comforting, is not easy to grasp. It is part of the visible and the invisible line from our Creed. This belief is more easily “caught” than “taught” as it is passed on from one generation to the next.



It's human nature to want to protect our children and grandchildren from any situations and experiences which might create pain, fear, anxiety, or loss – even things considered natural such as dying. But these experiences are opportunities to pass on our belief in the joy of the Easter promise, our belief in the Resurrection.

When elders died in our homes, when wakes were multiple day affairs, when cemeteries were connected to every church, it was a given children would be involved, watching, participating alongside us, providing us with multiple opportunities to discuss our trust in God's promise of new life, to witness first-hand the hope we place in the Resurrection. As medical science, health care and death/dying options have changed, so has our fast-paced often over-scheduled world changed the grieving process. Time and practices once devoted to such intergenerational rites and rituals have become shorter, sometimes eliminated, and seldom include children from the extended family or circle of friends. How will the next generation learn to grieve? How will the next generation learn to hold tight the faith-filled promise of new life?

We are past the midpoint of Lent, moving closer to the most glorious celebration of our faith – the Easter promise of new life. Use this week's readings as a reminder to think about how best to pass on your Easter faith to the next generations. You might find some thought-provoking suggestions and perspectives at www.teachingcatholickids.com. Enter “kids and catholic funerals” into their search bar on the upper right side of the home page. Be sure to read and re-read the last paragraph of the article. It is a beautiful and joy-filled Easter message to be shared with all of God's people of every age and every stage of life. Pass it on!
