In two weeks, the Liturgical Calendar features a special focus on the Baptism of Our Lord. It's a great weekend to consider connecting with your Godparents, Godchildren, or your children's Godparents. Invite everyone to attend Mass together. Share photos, memories, and bless one another with Holy Water. More presence, deeper relationships, stronger faith connections, sharing love as Jesus does. It's a win-win!
