

Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God.

This passage from John's gospel is typically used at a funeral. It is very appropriate and comforting to know that our faith will get us through this challenging time of loss. Our hearts are not troubled when we know the way our lives are gifted in God's presence.



However, I believe our daily lives and the decisions we make are also in need of that kind of comfort as well. Where is my life headed? Where is the world headed? This is very troubling at times; where do we find comfort?

Jesus is clear. 'I am the way and truth and the life.' If our lives, our principles and our goals in life align with Jesus' way, then we can be confident that life will unfold in God's way. If most of us in our world are following in Jesus' way, this is in God's way, then we can be confident our world will stay the course of truth and justice. Our intention in life is so important to this mission.

What is necessary for us is to know Jesus on a deep and personal level that transforms our lives to be as a 'Christ' in our world today, which brings hope to our individual lives and to the world around us. If we care for our neighbors, as we see in our first reading, with love and compassion, our world will be rich in faith and confidence in God's presence.

Be confident and surprised when we follow in God's way, truth and life!
